

/ To cultivate a bondage among students with similar interests, and with teachers and alumni with related expertise.



STEM

Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics

Cross-curriculums collaboration on the implementation of STEM education is one of the key teaching initiatives of 2017-18. To better facilitate collaborative curriculum planning and school-based curriculum development involving the three KLAs, namely, Science, Technology and Mathematics, we have joined the EDB school-based support for STEM.

Q

: For which form and subjects?

For Form 2, involving Integrated Science (IS), Design & Technology (DT) and Mathematics

Q

: What is the STEM Project about?

- Green STEM Room Lighting System Design: students have to apply what they have learnt in IS and DT in designing and making a model of green STEM room with energy saving or intelligent lighting system.
- It will involve the knowledge of 'electricity' learned in IS and that of 'design concept' and 'use of 3D printing/laser-cut machine' in DT. It might also involve some mathematical concepts learned.
- The experimentation and project work is to be conducted in the DT lessons.


