Our School

1. Mission

- To foster the whole-person education based on Christian principles; to guide students to lead an abundant life in Christ; and to carry the school tradition of perseverance, diligence, frugality, love for the school and respect for teachers.

2. History background

- Wa Ying College was first founded by the Methodist Church in Foshan, southern China in 1913. Since then, the school had been highly acclaimed and attracted students from afar, including many from Hong Kong. During World War II, the whole school moved to Hong Kong and established itself at Tung Chung on Lantau Island, and later in Shatin and Wan Chai. It moved back to Foshan after the war. It was eventually closed in 1951 as all schools had to be operated by the Chinese government.
- In 1962, the Wa Ying College Alumni Association of Hong Kong was formed. The alumni were keen on re-establishing Wa Ying in Hong Kong and made a proposal to the Chinese Methodist Church in 1969. The alumni pledged to raise funds to start the building project and entrusted the school to the church as in the past. With less than 400 alumni, nearly \$300,000 was raised. In addition to a loan of \$250,000 and a subsidy of \$2,000,00 granted by the Hong Kong Government, the dream to resume the school came true. Construction work began at its present site in 1970. In September 1971, the new Wa Ying College started with 18 teachers and 12 classes.

3. Facilities

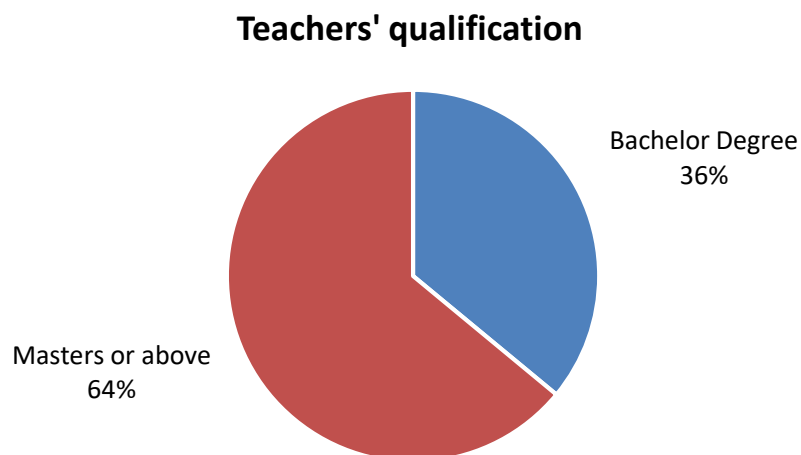
- The school site covers an area of about 4,500 square metres. There are 25 standard classrooms, a chapel, a staff common room and 15 special rooms or laboratories for the teaching of science subjects, geography, art, music, technical subjects, computer, home economics and languages. The new school annex with a lift, a new computer room, a new Geography room, two classrooms and a staff common room was open for use in the school year of 2001. Funding from QEF enables the establishment of the Graphic Communication Laboratory, the Robotics Laboratory and the Multimedia Learning Center installed with the latest IT equipment. The covered playground and the language laboratory were renovated and installed with IT equipment by August 2003. A new school archive room have been decorated and replaced the janitor's dormitory in November, 2018. A new café like area which is opposite the Tuck Shop was open for use by the end of 2022.
- The school hall is air-conditioned with a seating capacity of 1,000 and below it is a covered playground. On the mezzanine, there is a Chapel for worship and other religious activities. On the ground floor, there is a student canteen, a tuck shop and a room for the Student Union. The open space outside the building contains a basketball court and two volleyball courts.

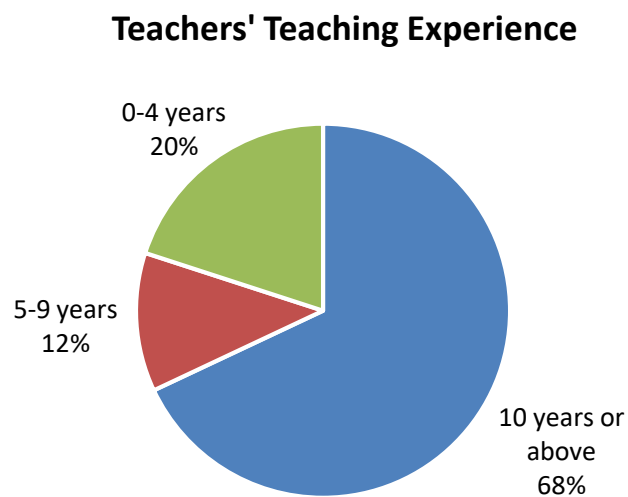

- The average teaching experience in the total number of years: 15 years



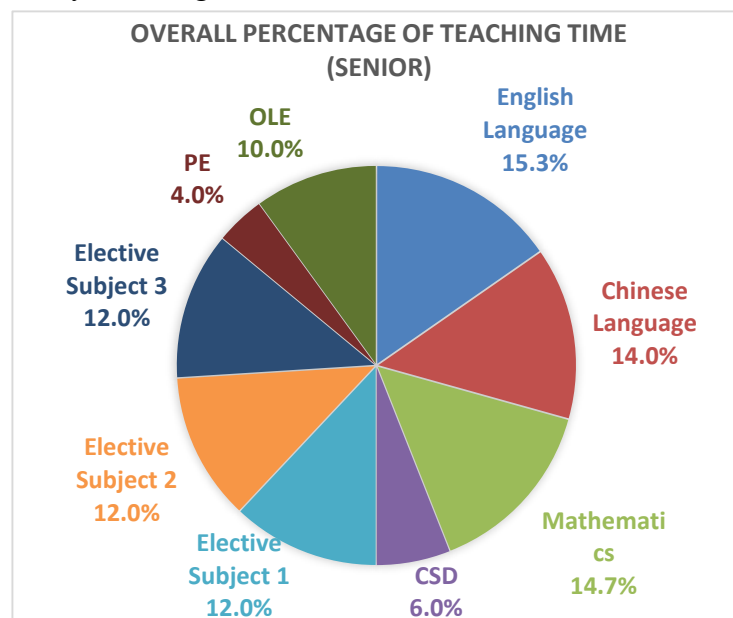
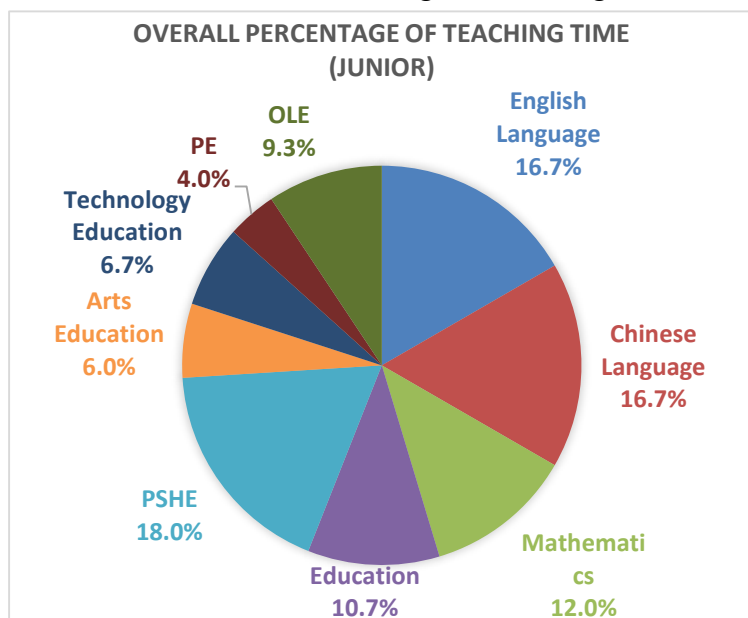

Major Concern 1: Fostering student potential with holistic school system.

- *Through the collaborative efforts of three boards, we aim to enhance students' potential cohesively with classroom teaching, curriculum design, life and life planning education system and phased approach.*

Target 1.1: Empower students by unleashing their potential in leadership, organization and taking care of others in all 3 boards		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● A framework of our holistic approach to carry out potentials development has been introduced and thoroughly discussed in EB. ● The directions have been mentioned with ECAC head and in Principal Tea Gathering. ● A calendar to encourage students to make plans to participate in competitions and activities according to their potential and future development has been designed and disseminated. ● The platforms to gather student leaders, including how to enhance Principal's Tea Gathering have been explored. ● The ambassador system under the committee to cultivate student leadership role has been reviewed. Student ambassadors from various committees underwent significant restructuring this year, with a renewed focus on nurturing leadership qualities and fostering a sense of ownership. This includes MCE ambassadors, LPEC ambassadors, PCS, and SIPC ambassadors, among others. ● The internal scholarship and award scheme has been revised. ● A new STEAM team to strengthen the cooperation and collaboration of different departments for this particular purpose has been set up. ● The number of student participants in various competitions has increased continuously. ● Short assemblies, the TV in the lobby, and the school website are frequently used platforms to showcase students' achievements. ● Under the collaboration of REC and MCE, some F.4 and F.5 students were selected to plan and organize a service activity involving all F.4 and F.5 students. This service activity echoed the F.4 LE lesson on 'Service Learning' that S4 students had in the first semester, providing students with the opportunity to take action. ● The service trip to Cambodia was successfully completed, including visits to a prison and providing medical services, allowing students to grow both physically and mentally through their experiences ● The Greater Bay Area Career Exploration Tour was jointly organized by teachers and senior form students and most of the participants showed positive feedback. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To keep enhancing collaboration among various committees to maximize students' potential while minimizing overlapping and preventing additional workload for teachers. ● Teachers should be more aware of the importance of nurturing students' leadership qualities through the ambassador scheme in junior grades, preparing them for broader leadership roles, such as in the student union. ● The arrangement of Principal's Tea Gathering can be enhanced. Target 1.2: Enhance students' potential by life and life planning education system- and phased-approach		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Study workshops, library lessons, and LAC workshops were conducted for S1 students, focusing on the implementation of basic learning habits at different stages. ● For S.2, career and life planning experiences are incorporated into C-cube classes. Students share their learning through end-of-year posters and presentations in C-cube classes briefing sessions. ● To support S.3 students in preparing for the streaming process, a series of life planning activities e.g. university visits, workshops, sharing of learning experiences by S.6 students and taster programs were implemented. These activities were designed to equip students with the necessary insights to make informed decisions regarding their academic pathways. ● This year, we celebrated students' transition to the senior phase through the Form 4 camp, which included team-building activities and alumni sharing on how to plan extracurricular activities, get involved in services, and participate in both school and community service elements in senior form. ● This year, two new initiatives were launched specifically for S.4 and S.5 students. These endeavors aim to foster a growth mindset and nurture life planning skills by encouraging students to embrace opportunities for personal development and continuous growth. The introduction of S.4-S.6 Life Planning Handbook for Potentials Development for S.4 students is a significant step in this direction. Furthermore, to equip students with firsthand information and facilitate informed decision-making, University Exploration Handbooks for attending Information Days were developed. ● Meetings were held with alumni domain coordinators to discuss the restructuring of five domains that align with university faculties. Alumni and teacher coordinators were assigned to each domain. Additionally, life planning programs and activities organized by LPEC were presented and explained to the alumni, enlisting their support for 2024-2025. ● For S.6, follow-up plans in subjects to enhance HKDSE performance were made and implemented. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Teachers collaboratively explored how to put active learning into practice through lesson observations and co-planning sessions themed "Teaching for Active Learning." ● A teacher development session on active learning was conducted in January 2025, focusing on strategies to promote students' deep thinking in the classroom, along with examples of thinking routines to enhance engagement. ● Through weekly and morning assemblies, students learnt from teachers' and students' experiences and insights with a focus on potential development and how to become active learners. According to the post-assembly reflections and student surveys, about 90% of the respondents agree that active learning was an effective approach to acquiring new knowledge. Some heads initiated form-based or lesson observations for professional exchange to promote mutual growth. ● The core members of the Mathematics Department, Chemistry, and Biology participated in the Joint school subject interflow, participating schools are 2 EMI schools under the same sponsor body i.e. Methodist College and Shatin Methodist College. The interflow content included SWOT analyses presented by each school, school visits, and lesson observations. ● All department and committee heads shared their experience in implementing active learning and fostering potential development at the Academic board meeting. ● Regarding interschool sharing and visits, some of our teaching members have participated in the lesson observation activities organized by our sister school (Foshan Huaying School) and the annual teacher exchange conference at another sister school (Beijing National Day Experimental School). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Active learning approach fostered a supportive environment where teachers can share insights and enhance their teaching practices. ● With the sharing in different board and department meetings, heads identified effective strategies in various contexts, leading to improved outcomes across departments. 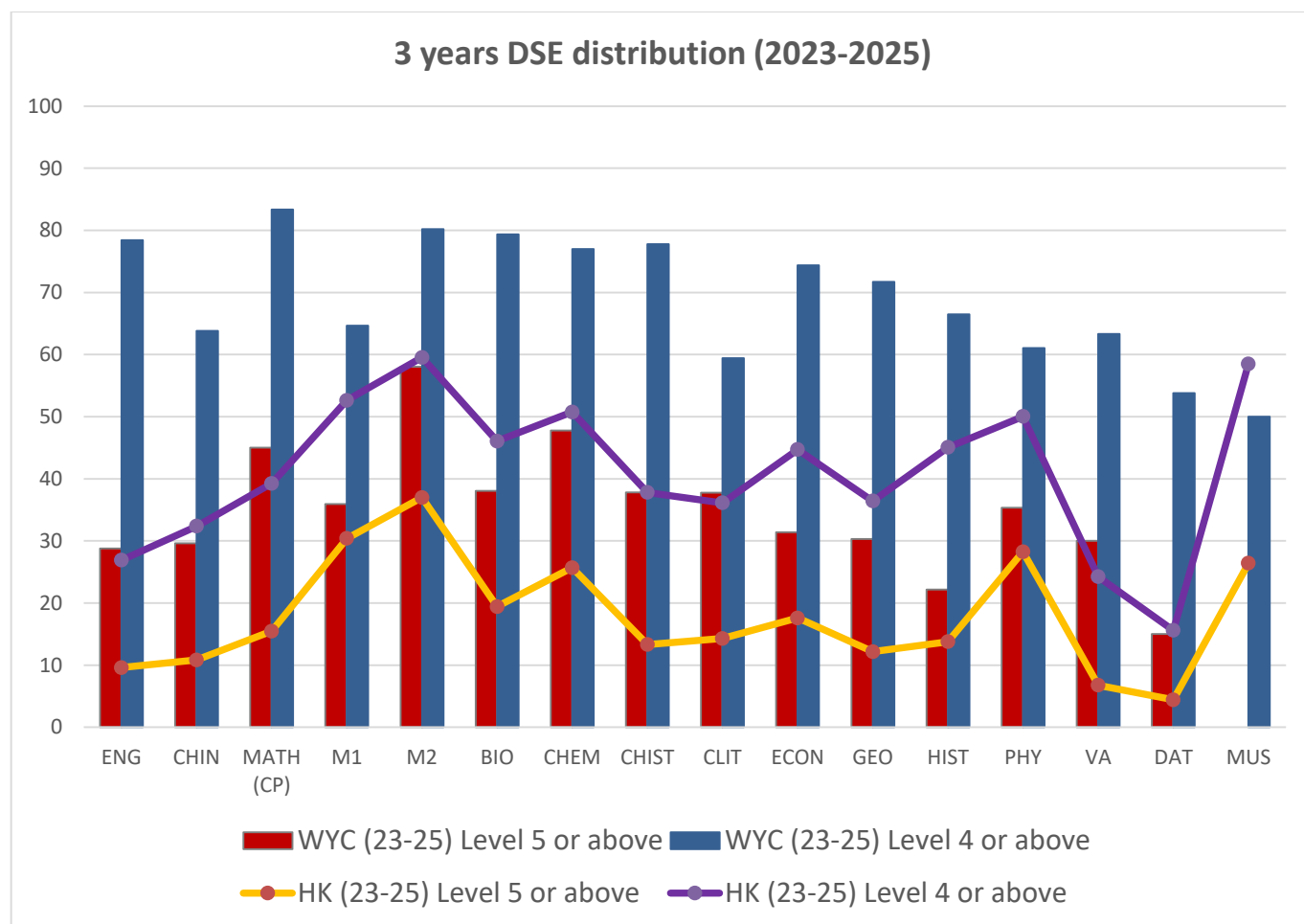
